Preparing to Travel Solo? Consider these Tips



Primary step to preventing problems from getting the best of you is to be aware when they could or do arise and then deciding how will you manage them. Prevention is important to keeping safe. When you prepare for all types of situations you immediately put yourself at a reduced risk of getting taken advantage of.

When packing and preparing for a solo trip, consider these tips:

- Leave your flashy items at home: Conspicuous jewelry, cameras, phones, and handbags attract attention from potential pickpockets who label you as a rich tourist that can easily be taken advantage of.
- Pack lightly: You will be carrying all of your luggage alone and if you are struggling with heavy suitcases you won't be able to be aware of your surroundings.
- Address of your hotel: Grab a business card or write down the address of your hotel so that if you ever get lost, you can just show your taxi driver the address.
- Consider packing these extras: A small flashlight in case you get caught outside after dark. A small whistle on a keychain or
 necklace to use to call for help. Change out your phone case to something older or not as flashy, this helps deter pickpockets
 from wanting to steal your phone.

Effective Risk Management

Factors such as physical environments and geopolitical situations can often catch companies off-guard or even go unnoticed. To guarantee effective risk management, organizations must reconsider risks on an ongoing basis.

~ Online Shopping Scams involve scammers pretending to be legitimate online sellers, either with a fake website or a fake ad on a genuine retailer site.

Advice: Check if the website or social media page has a refund and return policy. Avoid sellers that insist on immediate pay or do not provide adequate information on privacy, terms, and conditions of use. When making online payments,

only pay for items using a secure payment service.

~ A friendly stranger asks someone to watch his/her bag or purse. The stranger leaves and returns with a police officer or someone posing as one. Upon inspection, the bag is found to contain drugs or other illegal items. The criminals then extort money or valuables to avoid charges with the police.

Advice: Do not feel obligated to watch a person's belongings. Politely refuse, then walk away.
